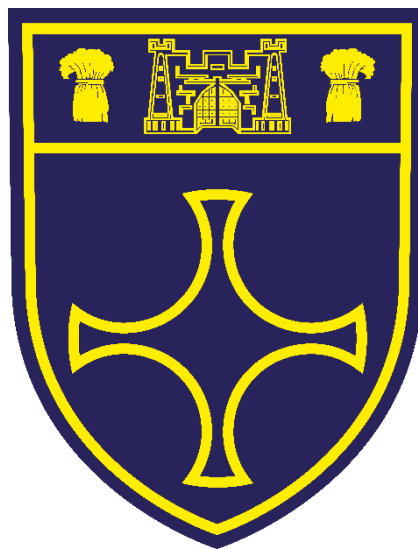

Rationale

Ian Ramsey CE Academy believes that effective home learning provision helps supports our **DEEP** curriculum so that every child will:

- **Develop** a love of learning, academic excellence, and **perseverance** in a Christian context.
- **Engage** in a wide range of opportunities in **joyful**, meaningful contexts to develop self-worth and **wisdom** through the mastery of knowledge and skills.
- **Encourage** themselves and others to be aspirational and make wise choices so that they are prepared for life.
- **Practise** equality of opportunity by valuing diversity, actively challenging prejudice and demonstrating **forgiveness** and **hope**.

Approach

- It is an expectation that every pupil in the academy will complete home learning as per this policy.
- Home learning will be a set task based on the use of a subject specific knowledge organiser written by specialist academy staff.
- Pupils are expected to complete home learning each night based on a fortnightly home learning timetable, a copy of which will be given to each pupil. Timetables are also available on the Academy website.
- All home learning will be set on Google Classroom and should be 'turned in' once completed.
- Individual departments will issue appropriate sanctions for non or late completion of home learning as per the Academy Behaviour Policy.
- Pupils will have home learning to complete each night of the week, which should be completed in one hour.
- Where pupils do not have access to a Chromebook, laptop or tablet on which to access Google Classroom and home learning resources, home learning club is available every night after school in the LRC, 2.45pm – 3.45.
- Paper copies of all home learning are available upon request from subject specific teachers.

Pupil expectations

- Ensure they complete their home learning each night as indicated on their home learning timetable.
- Complete home learning to a high standard and turn in their work on time.
- Let their teacher/s know if they experience any issues in completing their home learning.

Parental support

- Providing a quiet place for home learning to be completed.
- Asking children about their home learning and if they have completed it.
- Checking sufficient time has been spent on a task.
- Encouraging pupils to ask for help and support from their teachers if they need it.
