


As of 1st February 2023, Dayspring Trust have officially merged with Northern Lights Learning Trust. We are extremely excited about this opportunity to work together and the opportunities it will bring to our young people and to our staff.



Attendance

We know that during the last couple of years our children have lost some learning time and this will vary greatly within our academy, depending on personal circumstance. Excellent attendance is the first line of attack in regaining this learning. If your child is not in school they are not gaining the knowledge and skills for them to develop. As an Academy, **96% is our minimum expectation for our pupils** which still equates to 7 days absence from school. Having a slight cough and cold, for instance, is not a reason for staying off school. There is a clear impact on pupils' outcomes when the greater their absence from school; in some cases being a whole grade per subject on average. The national average for secondary schools is normally 95% - we want to be better than average!
