Communication

We endeavour to respond to parents and carers, within 48 hours of the initial contact. In some cases, a member of staff may contact you, to acknowledge your correspondence, and give you a timescale in which they can respond.



Please remember that we are a working academy, and it is not always possible to respond immediately, to parents and carers. We have a strict code of conduct across the academy about how we communicate with each other. 


Lunch Time arrangements


After half term we are going to be moving Year 7 to an earlier lunch sitting. They will finish lessons at 12:15pm and have social time outside (or inside during heavy rain or snow) and be called into the lunch hall at approximately 12:30pm. They will then return to lessons at 1.00pm.

Attendance

We know that during the last couple of years our children have lost some learning time and this will vary greatly within our academy, depending on personal circumstance. Excellent attendance is the first line of attack in regaining this learning. If your child is not in school they are not gaining the knowledge and skills for them to develop. As an Academy, 96% is our minimum expectation for our pupils which still equates to 7 days absence from school. Having a slight cough and cold, for instance, is not a reason for staying off school. There is a clear impact on pupils' outcomes when the greater their absence from school; in some cases being a whole grade per subject on average. The national average for secondary schools is normally 95% - we want to be better than average!
